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The Okefenokee RESA Board of Control believes that school activities and programs should reflect the best interest of students. The Okefenokee RESA Board of Control finds that such activities should be based on the personal development of the students rather than enhancement of the prestige of the school.

Student activities are allowed at each school level if such activities are implemented in a developmentally appropriate manner.
